The remaining three, along with the four other new members, have been incredible additions to our vocal sound, resulting in us having seven new voices when we attended this year's annual Regional Competition.

She wears her brooch to every rehearsal and plans to continue singing with our chorus, which makes us very happy!


Director Changes

Recent Challenges

This has been a challenging year for the chorus in a couple of significant ways. in January, our director Diane Sherley broke her foot and could only maneuver for several weeks by the use of a rolling knee walker. Then just as she was starting to get around better, Jenny Winsor broke her ankle in an accident at work and was not able to drive for several weeks!

Jenny has been tasked with transporting our chorus trailer in which we store our choral risers to rehearsal every week, but with her unable to drive, we received permission from the church where we rehearse to park our trailer in their parking lot. (Normally, we keep it in a locked facility.) Sadly, not even ten days after parking it in their parking lot, it was stolen! When we looked at replacing them, we discovered the price has nearly doubled in the years since we bought them. We announced the theft and began accepting donations and created a GoFundMe page to raise funds to replace them.

We found replacement risers on eBay which meant we didn't have to raise quite so much money in order to buy them. We ordered three sets at first and then bought two more sets so we now have all five sets again. Amazingly, we raised all but \$1000 toward our replacement goal. So many donated toward our replacement efforts. One person very generously donated the entire amount needed to buy a new trailer. We have now found a local signage company to put our name and logo on the new trailer as a deterrent to thieves. But none of this would be possible without the donations of our wonderful supporters. So we thank you, again!!
